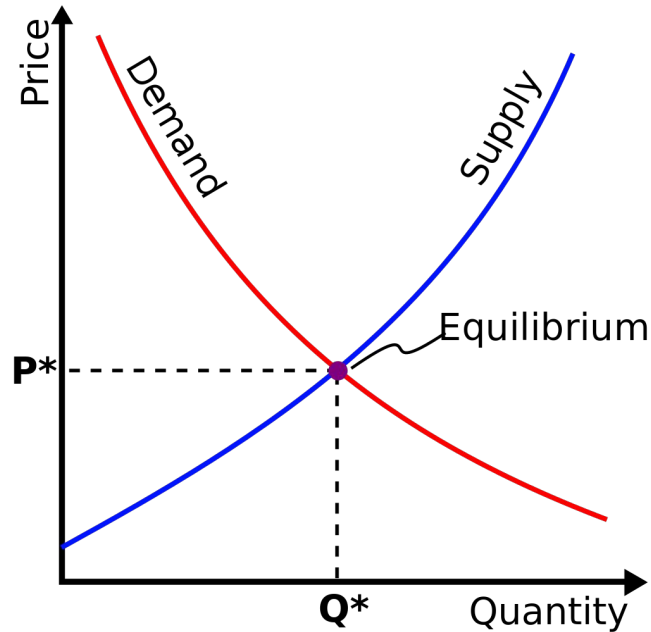

Students will obtain a thorough understanding of the principles of economics that apply to individual businesses, households and the role of government in promoting greater efficiency and equity in the economy. Students will analyze the determinants involving supply and demand, assess the nation’s economic growth and performance and the impact the business cycle has on growth and performance. This course also compares economic theories relating to fiscal monetary policy and identifies the factors leading to globalization and the need for international trade. This course may be taken for consumer education graduation credit.”
