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During this course of study, students will develop an understanding and be able to apply sociological concepts and perspectives concerning human groups that include attention to socialization, culture, organization, stratification and societies. This course will have student access a variety of resources to discuss/research and make claims based on text depended evidence. Students will express their views and knowledge of concepts through writing and class discussions.

# The Details

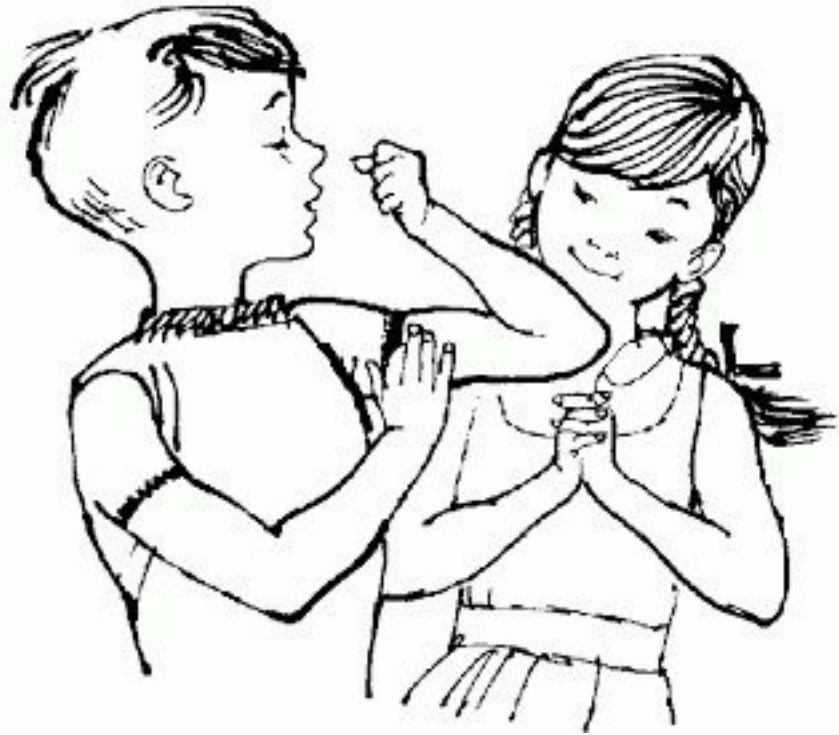
This is a ½ credit elective course that satisfies the behavioral sciences requirement and can be taken as honors or regular.
